

Dangerous goods at FedEx Express Poland

Transporting dangerous materials and substances may cause a threat to health and life, and therefore requires careful and accurate handling. We take appropriate steps to ensure health and safety of our customers, employees and the general public.

The purpose of the Dangerous Goods Transport Policy is to enable efficient monitoring and managing risks associated with the transportation of dangerous materials and substances, as part of FedEx Domestic Services (1).

Goods covered by the Dangerous Goods Transport Policy

Dangerous goods are all substances listed in Annex A to the European Agreement concerning the International Carriage of Dangerous Goods (ADR).



FedEx Express Poland sp.z o.o. policy on transporting dangerous goods

- FedEx Express Poland sp. z o.o. knowingly does not accept any dangerous goods for transportation without prior written consent (according to the procedure described below).
- Upon written consent, FedEx will only accept selected dangerous goods in limited quantities as defined in the applicable ADR Agreement.
- We do not offer a third-party payment service for shipments containing dangerous goods and accepted for transport (upon prior arrangement).

Dangerous Goods at FedEx Express Poland

Procedure for accepting shipments containing dangerous materials

Customers who ship dangerous goods must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Complete and return the "Dangerous Goods Declaration" to give details of each dangerous substance shipped. The declaration is available electronically on fedex.com in the Download Center section.
- 2. Obtain a written consent from FedEx Express Poland sp. z o.o. for shipping dangerous substances listed in the "Dangerous Goods Declaration" with an individual number of the DG customer. FedEx Express reserves the right to verify approval for shipping dangerous goods at least every two years.

Packaging

Customers are responsible for the appropriate classification, packaging and labeling of shipments containing dangerous goods, all in accordance with applicable statutory provisions. FedEx packaging cannot be used to transport dangerous goods.

There are 9 hazard classes for dangerous goods
