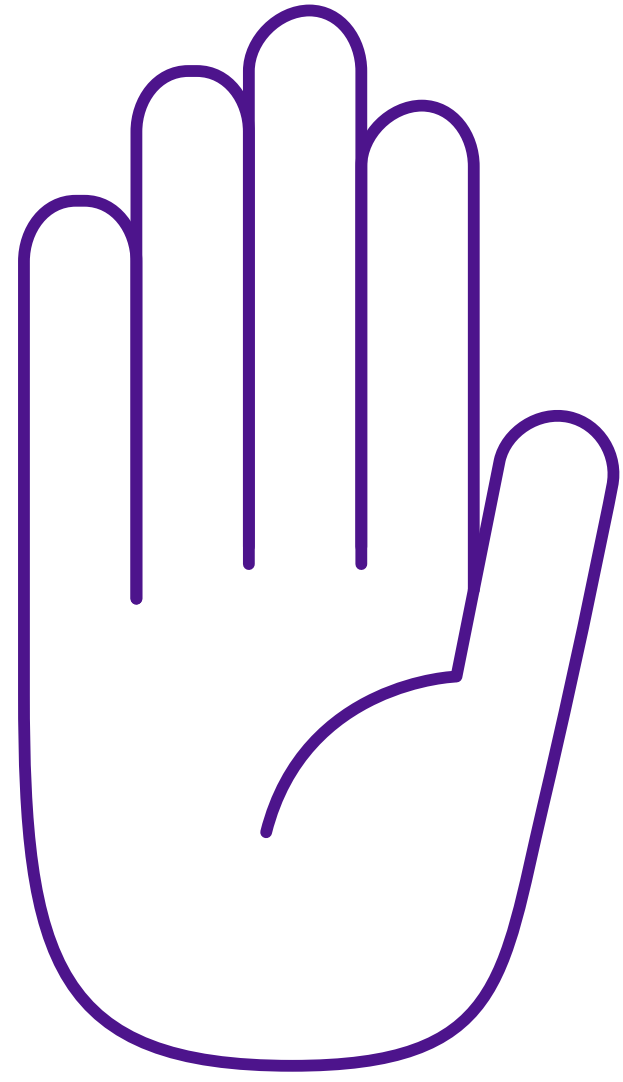


# Help us protect your shipments

Please take the following into account:



## PROHIBITED ITEMS

- Hazardous materials and waste.
- Firearms
- Sharp objects (knives, machetes, razors, etc.)
- Drugs, psychotropics, and narcotics without a prescription.
- Foreign lottery tickets and advertisements.
- Money, credit titles (checks, consignment notes, promissory notes, etc.) to the bearer or negotiable.
- Jewelry.
- Organs, tissues, and human corpses.
- Perishable foods (meat, fresh fish, and seafood, dairy and its derivatives).
- Electronic cigarettes.
- Animal skins and hides.
- Plants and animals (living or dead, taxidermy).
- Ink (silk-screen printing).
- Egg box packaging.
- Black rafts.
- UN-certified box packaging.
- Recycled box packaging with hazard labels (lozenges)
- Ivory
- Fertile egg.
- Illegal, counterfeit, smuggled, prohibited or piracy articles.
- Pornography or offensive content.
- Seeds, except beans and corn in limited quantities.



## Hazardous materials are defined as follows:

Type	Examples
 <b>Explosives:</b> Materials that can explode, project, or burn.	Fireworks, explosives, cartridges, bullets. 
 <b>Gas:</b> Compressed or liquefied substances, whether in solution or cryogenic.	Butane gas tanks, oxygen, fire extinguishers, gas lighters. 
 <b>Flammable liquids:</b> Substance with an ignition point below 60°C.	Gasoline, acetone, solvent-based paint, alcohol, injector cleaners. 
 <b>Flammable solids:</b> Solid, flammable, self-reactive, explosive, and desensitized materials reacting with liquids.	Matches, sodium, potassium. 
 <b>Oxidizing substances and organic peroxides:</b> Substances that, by releasing oxygen, contribute to the combustion of the materials surrounding them.	Household cleaners, hair dyes. 
 <b>Toxic and infectious substances:</b> Toxic or infectious substances (solid, liquid, or gaseous).	Poisons, bloody gauzes, needles, used knives, pesticides, insecticides. 
 <b>Radioactive materials:</b> Substances that release certain types of radiation.	Uranium, plutonium. 
 <b>Corrosive substances:</b> Solid or liquid substances that may corrode metals and damage animal and/or plant tissues upon direct contact with the substance.	Car batteries, acids. 
 <b>Miscellaneous dangerous substances and objects:</b> Solid or liquid chemical substances which are a mixture of the previous groups and which by their nature cannot be listed in any of the above 8 categories.	Dry ice, aerosols, car safety air bags.
