



Direct-to-Consumer Wine Shipping State Reference Guide

The Direct-to-Consumer Wine Shipping State Reference Guide is a resource for licensed wineries and retailers that have executed a FedEx Alcohol Shipping Agreement and want to tender packages of wine to FedEx Express or FedEx Ground for transport to consumers. A consumer shipment includes any shipment destined to a residence. FedEx only accepts shipments of wine from licensed shippers that have executed a FedEx Alcohol Shipping Agreement.

The terms of shipping are governed by the FedEx Service Guide, FedEx Alcohol Shipping Agreement, and any applicable rate agreement. The shipper is responsible for knowing and complying with all applicable laws and regulations in both the origin and destination states, including any state requirement that the shipper hold a direct-to-consumer permit or license prior to shipping into the state. The shipper is also responsible for determining whether it and the consignee meet all applicable requirements and whether such a shipment may be legally transported by common carrier.

This guide does not constitute legal advice and only reflects FedEx Express and FedEx Ground policies regarding where FedEx will transport wine shipments on behalf of winery and retailer customers. Shippers may need a permit or license to ship into certain states. Please consult an attorney for information regarding the wine shipping laws in each state.

¹Shipping direct to consumer in these [Alaska ZIP codes](#) is allowed.

²Each of these states allows certain of their in-state retailers to ship wine to consumers in the state. However, each of the states prohibits retailers outside of the state from shipping alcohol to consumers in the state.

³Residents of Arkansas and Rhode Island must participate in an on-site sale at the winery's premises for wine to be directly shipped to them.

⁴Per state reciprocal laws, shipments are only allowed from those retailers in states recognized as also allowing direct-to-consumer wine shipping by out-of-state retailers.

⁵Florida may contain areas known as dry towns/counties that prohibit direct-to-consumer alcohol shipments. As expressed in the FedEx Alcohol Shipper Agreement, it is the responsibility of the shipper to fully comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and orders applicable to shipments of alcohol. Please contact the appropriate state alcohol beverage commission for more information.

⁶Direct Shipper permits are required; contact New Hampshire Liquor Commission (603-271-8543). Alcohol shipments PROHIBITED to Dry Town: Ellsworth.

⁷Because the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement (ABLE) Commission has interpreted Oklahoma law as prohibiting fulfillment houses from shipping to Oklahoma consumers on behalf of holders of Oklahoma Direct Wine Shipping Permits, holders of Oklahoma Direct Wine Shipping Permits may not use fulfillment houses to ship to Oklahoma consumers.

⁸Shipping direct to consumers in these [WV ZIP codes](#), cities, or counties may be prohibited under applicable law.
