## FedEx Express, FedEx Ground and FedEx Freight fee and surcharge changes

## The following surcharge changes will take effect in 2021\*

Additional Handling Surcharge Express Package and Ground Services A surcharge applies to any package that: (Dimension) 1) measures greater than 48 inches along its longest side; 2) measures greater than 30 inches along its second-longest side; (Weight) 3) has an actual weight greater than 50 lbs. (FedEx U.S. Express Package Services and U.S. Ground Services) 4) has an actual weight greater than 70 lbs. (FedEx International Express Package Services and International Ground Services) (Packaging) Please consult the FedEx Service Guide for full list of criteria.	Effective Jan. 18, 2021, a surcharge applies to any Express and Ground package that measures greater than 105 inches in length and girth — the length and girth is length plus (two times the height) plus (two times the width). High Cost Service Area Surcharge FedEx Freight	Effective Jan. 18, 2021, there will be a FedEx Freight surcharge for high-cost service areas. International Out-of-Delivery-Area Surcharge and International Out-of-Pickup-Area Surcharge Currently, shipments delivered to or picked up from remote and less-accessible locations outside the U.S. are assessed an International Out-of-Delivery-Area Surcharge or an International Out-of-Pickup-Area Surcharge.  View a list of postal codes or cities where these surcharges	Effective Jan. 18, 2021, certain international shipments to/from the U.S. are assessed an International Out-of-Delivery-Area Surcharge or International Out-of-Pickup-Area Surcharge for International Express Freight services based on ZIP code location of the pickup or delivery. ## Fuel Surcharge for U.S. Domestic Express Freight

For FedEx Express, the fuel surcharge is a percentage assessed on the net package rate plus applicable surcharges. The fuel surcharge percentage is subject to weekly adjustment based on the weekly U.S. Gulf Coast (USGC) spot price for a gallon of kerosene-type jet fuel, as published by the U.S. Department of Energy. The surcharge now in effect applies to all FedEx Express® U.S., U.S. ex¬port and U.S. import shipments, except for FedEx International Express Freight® and FedEx International Airport-to-Airport<sup>5M</sup> shipments.

Effective Feb. 1, 2021, the fuel surcharge for U.S. Domestic Express Freight services will be a charge per pound assessed on the rated weight of the shipment. The charge per pound will be subject to weekly adjustment based on the weekly published U.S. Gulf Coast (USGC) spot price for a gallon of kerosene-type jet fuel.
