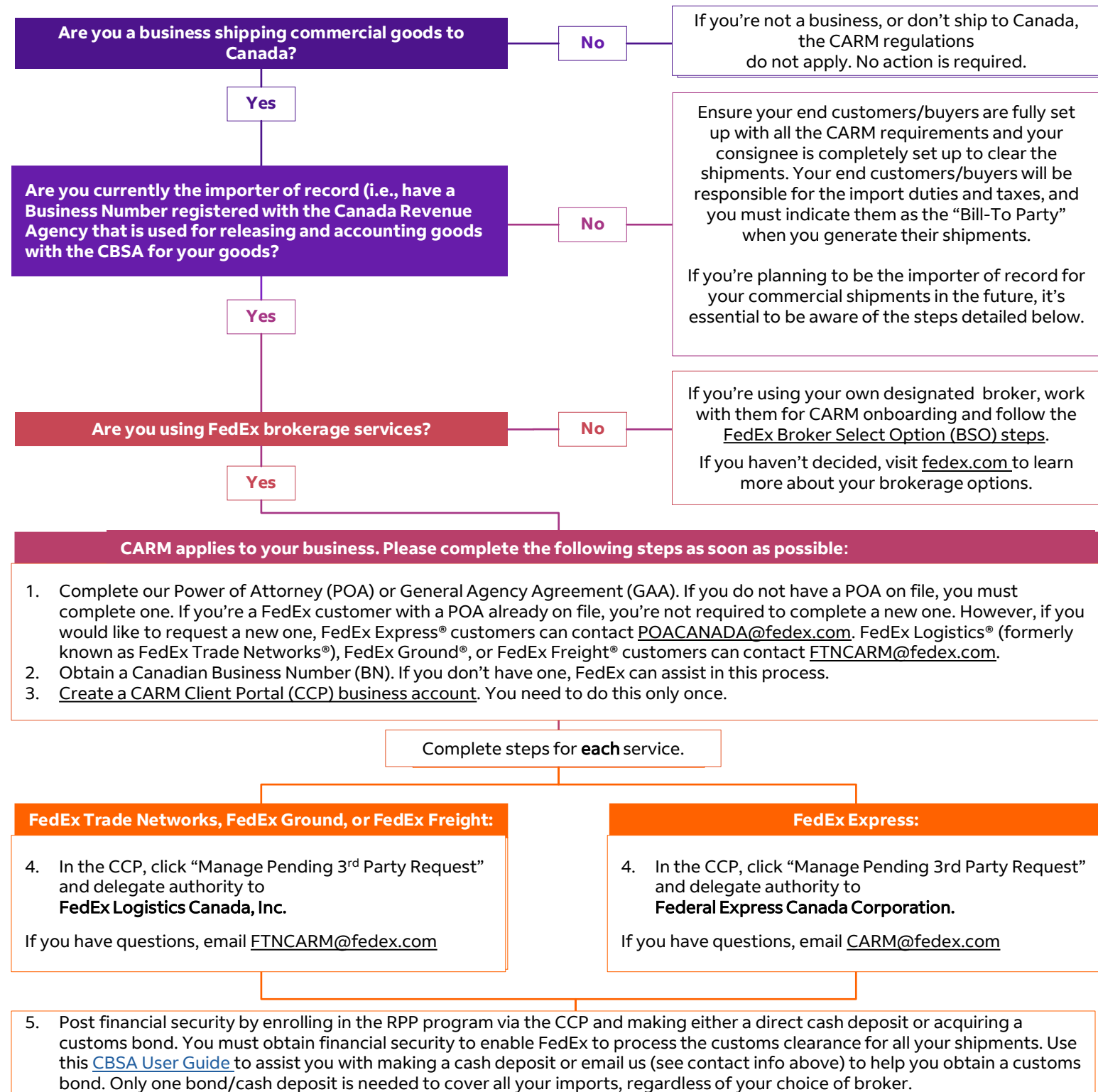


How to prepare for Canada CARM

Help prevent clearance delays by ensuring your company is compliant with the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) Assessment and Revenue Management (CARM) program requirements. These industry-wide requirements impact the management of commercial goods imported into Canada, including duty and tax reporting and collection. If you're importing commercial goods into Canada, answer the questions below and take the appropriate steps to help ensure your FedEx shipments aren't delayed now that the [CARM Release Prior to Payment \(RPP\) transition period has ended](#).

Important: Importers have the option to pay the CBSA directly for their import duties and taxes through the CCP. To avoid duplicate payments to the CBSA, importers who want to pay the CBSA directly must notify FedEx by completing an agreement. [Click here for FedEx Express](#).
